- Councilwoman DerAsadourian had no report.

Councilwoman Eddy

- Councilman Eddy reported budget discussions with departments start tomorrow morning at 8:00am starting with First Aid and Fire. The other departments will follow in early December.
- Committee Chairs are reminded that if their respective groups have capital requests, they will have to do their due diligent in explaining why the Borough should invest in the request in upcoming fiscal year.
- Regarding technology, much progress is being made to the new OEM/Meeting Room. The flooring, painting and most of the wiring is completed and we are waiting on delivery of the conference table.
- Regarding CivicReady, Councilman Eddy has confirmed with Brent MacConnell the school's intended participation. The contract will be signed this week and a training schedule will be set up.
- The Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) has discussed with the Fire Department about creating a plan on sharing the Drone with other departments. The LEPC is also working on a program to have the assisted living facilities invest in obtaining more stair chairs.

Councilwoman Doran Eulner

- Councilwoman Doran Eulner reported the Fire Department had 19 calls in October and a total of 308-man hours.
- The floor installation is to commence this week in the Fire House. The fire trucks are temporarily housed within the DPW garage except for one vehicle which is to be kept at the Fire House.
- First Aid had 51 dispatched calls in October 43 were in town and 8 were out of town.
- The Shade Tree Commission held a Pruning Seminar for residents this past Saturday. It was well attended considering this is a new program. The Shade Tree Commission plans on holding the seminar again in October 2020.
- The Shrewsbury Community Garden has officially closed for the season.
- Councilwoman Doran Eulner attended the Homesteader's Meeting last week and she announced they are holding a happy hour on Thursday, December 5th at the Oceanport Marina. All are welcome!

Councilman Gilmartin

- Councilman Gilmartin reported soccer just wrapped up for the season. There are some goals still out on Manson Field DPW will remove the goals off the field and put them away as time permits.
- Recreation is now underway with volleyball, street hockey and flag football. Manson Field is being used for the older children and Sickles Park is being used for the 3rd and 4th graders.
- Councilman Gilmartin is excited to report that Robert Lynch of Park Avenue will be stepping up to take over as Chairperson of the Recreation Committee effective in 2020. Robert Lynch will be succeeding Mike Goldberg who has served for the last three years. All is looking forward to seeing Robert Lynch taking over the helm.

Councilman Sena

- Councilman Sena reported he attended the Environmental Commission Meeting last week. There were lengthy discussions at this meeting regarding a general ban on single use plastics. Some residents were going around to have people sign a petition, to which Councilman Sena explained to the Commission that with our form of government it is best to write a letter to the governing body with recommendations for consideration. The next Environmental Commission Meeting is in January.

- Mayor Anderson reported he attended the Homesteader's Meeting with Councilwoman Eulner. It was a productive meeting whereby the Mayor answered many questions the Homesteaders had such as liquor licensing and vacant properties.

- Ms. Muttie had no report.

Mayor Anderson opened the floor to the public.

Marge Clark, 213 Garden Road – Ms. Clark congratulated the Councilmembers who were reelected to another term.

Ms. Clark mentioned she noticed a stop sign in Atlantic Highlands that would work on White Street to help non-residents who aren't on this road often notice the stop sign better. It is Stop Sign that blinks. Ms. Clark also referenced the Solar Speed Sign on Patterson Avenue, and recommended that if it wasn't stationary perhaps moving it to White Street would help. Councilman DeSalvo agreed and informed Ms. Clark that the Council has already budgeted to order additional signs next year.

After the last Council Meeting Ms. Clark spoke with Councilman Eddy and asked how the council would feel about a resident reaching out to the state regarding the traffic light on Highway 35 and White Street. Ms. Clark commented she reached out to Senator Gopal, after speaking with the Senator's office, they explained that the DOT was contacted and that there was
