Presentations

Mayor Anderson commented Resolution 2020-028 highlights the historic importance of women's voting rights and February 9th marks 100 years since the State of New Jersey ratified the 19th Amendment and August 26th marks 100 years since the Amendment was officially ratified and became part of the United States Constitution.

Mayor Anderson explained Monmouth County Clerk Christine Giordano Hanlon is launching a year-long county-wide program to commemorate the 100th anniversary of women's suffrage.

Monmouth County Clerk Christine Giordano Hanlon thanked the governing body for inviting her to come to this meeting. She commented on the importance of continuing to teach future generations about this historic campaign and encourages governing bodies of all 53 municipalities of Monmouth County to adopt the resolution commemorating the centennial. County Clerk Christine Hanlon distributed yellow roses to each member of Girl Scout Troop 607. The yellow rose symbolizes the women's suffrage movement.

Resolution 2020-028 Commemorating the Centennial of the Ratification of the 19th Amendment was read onto record by the members of the Girl Scout Troop 607:

RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE CENTENNIAL OF THE RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT

- *WHEREAS*, the year Two Thousand and Twenty marks the 100th Anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment of the United States Constitution; and
- **WHEREAS**, women fought for the right to vote for more than a century and persevered in the face of resistance; and
 - WHEREAS, many New Jersey women advocated for the right to vote; and
- **WHEREAS**, Monmouth County was the home to many suffragists both male and female, and suffrage rallies and events occurred within Monmouth County's borders; and
- **WHEREAS**, February 9, 2020 will mark the centennial of the New Jersey ratification of the 19th Amendment; and
- **WHEREAS**, August 26, 2020 will mark the nationwide centennial of the 19th Amendment officially becoming part of the United States Constitution, after the required number of states had ratified; and
- WHEREAS, daughters, granddaughters, and great-granddaughters of the women who fought so hard to vote have been making their voices heard at the polls for nearly 100 years; and
- **WHEREAS**, women are running for office and currently in elected office in large numbers in Monmouth County, follow in the footsteps of these great suffragists; and
- **WHEREAS**, there are currently over 200,000 women registered to vote in Monmouth County, New Jersey; and
- WHEREAS, all government entities on the local, state and national level should commemorate and recognize this historic milestone and reaffirm its commitment to empowering and uplifting the voices of women.
- **NOW**, therefore be it resolved that the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Shrewsbury, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, do hereby
- (1) celebrate and recognize the 100^{th} Anniversary of the passage and ratification of the 19^{th} Amendment to the United States Constitution providing for women's suffrage; and
- (2) honor the role of the ratification of the 19th Amendment in promoting the core values of our democracy as set forth in the Constitution of the United States; and
- (3) reaffirm our desire to continue strengthening democratic participation and to inspire future generations to cherish and preserve the historic precedent established by the 19th Amendment.

Councilwoman Eulner made a motion to adopt Resolution 2020-028, seconded by Councilwoman DerAsadourian with ayes by all Councilmembers present.

RESOLUTION 2020-030 - ADOPTING A POLICY CONCERNING TIME CLOCKS AND INCORPORATING THAT POLICY INTO THE BOROUGH EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK/POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to adopt a policy concerning the use of an employee timekeeping system; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has the managerial prerogative to adopt such a policy and to implement a timekeeping system, and, indeed, wishes to do so; and

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes for such policy to be included in the Borough's Employee Handbook/Policies and Procedures Manual.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Shrewsbury that the attached Time Clock Policy, incorporated herein by reference, is hereby adopted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aforementioned policy shall be incorporated into the Borough's Employee Handbook/Policies and Procedures Manual; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Administrator shall ensure that all employees are notified of the adoption of this policy.

RESOLUTION 2020-031 - AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH MOSQUITO CONTROL DIVISION TO CONDUCT AERIAL MOSQUITO CONTROL OPERATIONS WITHIN SHREWSBURY BOROUGH

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:9-27 et seq. has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or to exterminate mosquitos within the county; and WHEREAS, the County has instituted an Integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control, and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population within the County of Monmouth; and

WHEREAS, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operations over a designated "congested area," the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulation (FAR Part

Officer.

137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision over which the aircraft is to be operated; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Shrewsbury is designated as a "congested area" by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The Governing Body hereby authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division or its agent to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the municipality designated by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat or areas designated harboring high populations of mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a health hazard, or both with the understanding that:
 - a. the County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial applications by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies, and
 - b. such operations will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations, and
 - c. the County will notify the police department of each municipality over which aerial pesticide operations are planned prior to commencement of such operations.

RESOLUTION 2020-032 - APPROVING VOLUNTEER FIREMAN ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

WHEREAS, the Shrewsbury Hose Company No. 1 has selected Matthew Samaha for active membership; and

WHEREAS, the Shrewsbury Hose Company No. 1 has requested municipal approval from the Borough Council of the Borough of Shrewsbury for said appointment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Shrewsbury, Monmouth County, New Jersey, that the application for active membership by Matthew Samaha to the Shrewsbury Hose Company No. 1 is hereby approved.

This software will allow for online applications and approvals as well as online storage of records/information. RESOLUTION 2020-034 - AUTHORIZING CONTRACTS WITH CERTAIN APPROVED STATE CONTRACT VENDORS FOR CONTRACTING UNITS PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:11-12a

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WHEREAS, the Borough of Shrewsbury, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-12(a), may by resolution and without advertising for bids, purchase any goods or services for any State contracts entered into on behalf of the State by the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of the Treasury; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Shrewsbury has the need on a timely basis to purchase goods or services utilizing State contracts; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Shrewsbury intends to enter contract with SHI International Corp. through this resolution, which shall be subject to all the conditions applicable to the current State contracts.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Shrewsbury authorizes the Purchasing Agent to purchase Spatial Data Logic Software from SHI International Corp. State Contract Number A89851, in the amount of \$22,650.00, pursuant to all conditions of the individual State contract; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Borough of Shrewsbury, shall either certify the full maximum amount against the budget at the time the contract is awarded, or no contract amount shall be chargeable or certified until such time as the goods or services are ordered or otherwise called for prior to placing the order, and a certification of availability of funds is made by the Chief Finance Officer; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration of the contract between the Borough of Shrewsbury and SHI International Corp. shall be for the period of one year beginning from the go-live date.

Reports of Council

Councilwoman DerAsadourian

Councilwoman DerAsadourian reported an outside consultant, Brown and Brown, was hired to assist the Borough with insurance needs. The Community Alliance has had a change in leadership and the Committee is looking to schedule a meeting to start some new projects. If anyone is interested in joining the committee, please sign up! Safe Routes to School is also working on scheduling a meeting since Spring is just around the corner.

Councilwoman Eddy

Councilman Eddy reported the DPW Committee had its first meeting of the year, which went well. Mary Russell was introduced as the new member of the team out in DPW. Also new this year is the implementation of SDL software which will help with DPW job tracking and workflow. From a cyber/ technology perspective, Councilman Eddy commented a police audit of computers was completed in order to ensure compliance from a security perspective. Soon all computers in the Borough will be in compliance. Councilman Eddy also reported Monroe and North Monroe will be finished once the asphalt plants open again, sometime in March.

Councilwoman Doran Eulner

Councilwoman Eulner reported the Open Space Committee met with the Administrator and Borough Engineer, to discuss the Patterson Avenue Park as well as other 2020 projects. Councilwoman Eulner also commented the Community Garden still has plots available and their next meeting is March 10th.

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Councilman Gilmartin

Councilman Gilmartin reported Recreation is gearing up for their busy season, with baseball, softball and lacrosse all slated to start mid-March. He had a meeting with the new recreation chairperson and Councilman Gilmartin will be having a coaches' meeting with all interested parties on March 10th.

Councilman Sena

Councilman Sena reported March 21st is the Annual Spring Gala for SBS. Regarding the Environmental Commission, Councilman Sena watched an informative presentation from one of the vendors that has been contracted with the County to build a new facility in Tinton Falls about single stream plastics. Councilman Sena suggested possibly having the vendor give a presentation to the Council. Also, Councilman Sena and the Finance Committee had meetings with the department heads for the budget and is aiming for the budget presentation to be mid-March.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Anderson reported the new borough website is up and running and thanked all that helped, especially Maureen Muttie, Mary Russell and Kerry Quinn. In addition, CivicReady is also up and running and Mayor Anderson hopes and urges everyone to sign up. There will be an outreach to the community to encourage residents to sign up. The Mayor Anderson explained CivicReady is the new mass notification system that you can create an account for and receive notification about anything that you might be interested in. Whether it be recreation, emergency notices, school information, etc.

Clerk/Administrator's Report

Ms. Muttie commented that she is working with Mary Russell to roll out communication to the public to bring awareness to the new mass notification system, CivicReady.

Open the Floor to the Public

Mayor Anderson opened the floor to the public.

Sara Bumber, 5 Elm Lane - Ms. Bumber is a new member to the Safe Routes to School Committee and wanted to formally introduce herself to Council. Ms. Bumber spoke to Ms. Muttie earlier in the week regarding having a spot on the agenda to discuss the drop off and pickup at SBS. While Ms. Bumber is aware this is not a part of SRTS it is still an issue that residents are facing. Councilwoman DerAsadourian explained that in the past, the SRTS Committee would get together with the Borough Engineer, Superintendent of SBS, and Chief of Police to go over the ideas and the plans that have been put in place. Councilwoman DerAsadourian and Ms. Bumber will plan a meeting in the coming weeks to discuss further.

Jennifer Combs – address not provided

Ms. Combs would like to have Resolution 2019-113 updated to reflect established case law, and 1st Amendment when it comes to filming public meetings. Mr. Padula, Borough Attorney, spoke on behalf of the Council. Mr. Padula received the emails from Ms. Combs as well as spoke with her earlier in the day. Mr. Padula and Ms. Combs have a disagreement as to how the law reads.
