Students, teachers and staff are enjoying an updated and expanded Shrewsbury Borough School.

The building addition that was the key project of an October 2022 bond referendum was completed just in time for the new school year. The community approved the referendum for the 21,300-square-foot addition, along with critical infrastructure and safety improvements.

The bright and modern addition includes three pre-K classrooms to better serve Shrewsbury families. New playground equipment provides opportunities for activity and social time.

A new all-purpose room in the addition helps accommodate all the activities of a busy pre-K-8 school day. The new space functions as a cafeteria and provides flexibility for other activities, while the original gym is being used for physical education, assemblies, sports practice and drama club performances.

This addition will be a true asset to Shrewsbury, serving and enriching the community for generations.

Other projects improved security, comfort and efficiency throughout the building.

Security upgrades include enhanced entrances to let Main Office staff control visitor access, new classroom doors with instant locking mechanisms, and new windows with shatter-resistant film.

Classrooms were equipped with air conditioning to enhance student health and focus, and HVAC and electrical systems were upgraded to more efficient models. The new systems will save the district on energy costs and avoid costly repairs.

The school held a building opening ceremony in August to celebrate with the community.

TREE REMOVAL RESPONSIBILITIES & PERMITS
Bill Gerth, SHADE TREE COMMISSION

Shrewsbury's Shade Tree Commission (STC) keeps a close eye on our street trees—and recent inspections have flagged many that are dead or dying. These aren't just eyesores—they're real hazards to walkers, bikers, and drivers.

If a tree is on your property, it's your responsibility. That includes removing dead trees, grinding stumps, and pruning weak or overhanging limbs. In some cases, replanting may be required.

If the Code Enforcement Officer spots a dangerous tree, you'll get a notice—and ignoring it could land you a court summons.

Planning tree work? Don't forget: a Tree Removal Permit is required 30 days in advance, whether you or your tree service submits it.

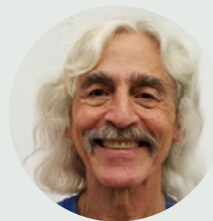

DAVID LEVY: ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

David Levy, a Shrewsbury Resident since 1987 with his wife, Tina Behr. David is a forever teacher and currently President of the Guild of Creative Art where he has been a member for 13 years. The Guild is the oldest and one of the largest artist cooperatives in Monmouth County which is located here in town at 620 Broad Street.

First inspired by an exhibit at MOMA (The Museum of Modern Art) in 1965 with his aunt, this "Aha Moment" started his career as an Optical Artist. With initial thoughts of becoming an architect, David's career segued to Fine Arts where his love of optical art illusions

and math were joined. David is a hard edge painter which means a razor and tape are used rather than a paintbrush to create perfect edges. Geometric design is used throughout David's work.

David's education beyond Lehigh University includes an M.A. in Art History from Rutgers University followed by a career as a Gifted and Talented Teacher in two public elementary schools. With time, he moved to teach behaviorally challenged children, where he adapted, revised and rewrote curriculum to better serve this population.

Throughout his career, he turned to painting, sculpture and architecture to inspire his students to see that learning is empowering and fun. David has been honored with many awards and grants throughout his career, and can be found at The Guild educating all on various exhibits held throughout the year.

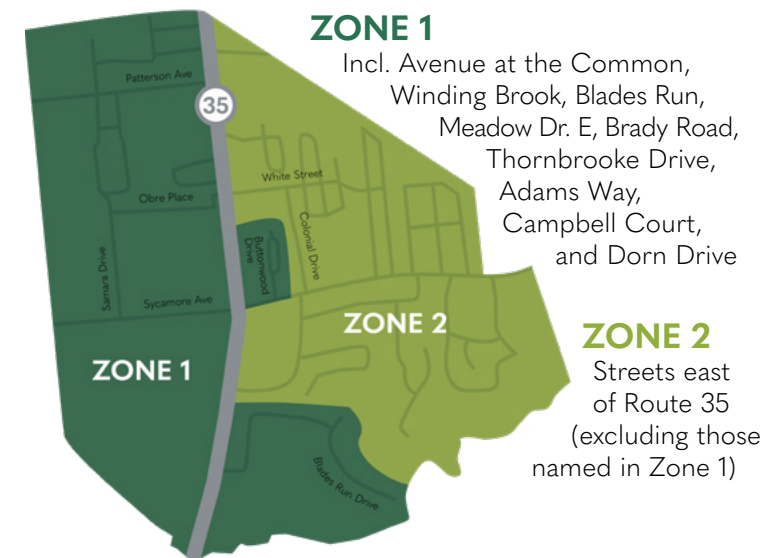
Thank you, Deidre

Bulk Trash

Please note that **ONLY THREE (3) BULK ITEMS** per household can be put out for pickup on these days and it should be put out with your regular trash.

There will not be any other bulk pickups during the year.

If you need a major bulk pickup, call DPW and schedule a dumpster.

Curbside Recycling

All collected recycled material may be intermixed in the same container — not to exceed 50 lbs. per container.

All materials must be placed at curb by 6:00 am.

Recycling at the DPW yard

Cardboard container – Please break down boxes when placing into the cardboard container.

Electronics – Accepted during normal recycling center hours. Appointment not necessary.

Styrofoam – Recycle your clean white styrofoam only.

Paper – Any paper/newspapers mail.
No shredded paper.

Bottles & cans – No plastic bags are allowed in container.

Brush & Leaves

NO BRUSH shall be placed at curbside after 7:00 am on October 10th.

BRUSH collected **APRIL** through **OCTOBER 10th**. All brush must be cut to maximum of 6' lengths.

LEAVES are collected from late **OCTOBER** through **DECEMBER**. LEAVES shall only be placed at the curb or along the roadway during the 7 days prior to the scheduled pick-up.

LEAVES and BRUSH shall not be placed closer than 10 feet from any storm drain. Placement of such yard waste at the curb or along the street at any other time is a violation of Borough ordinance. (Ordinance: Yard Waste, Chap. 215-III)

BRUSH and LEAVES are recyclable and must be in two separate piles.

PLEASE DO NOT COMMINGLE LEAVES WITH BRUSH AS DPW PERSONNEL WILL NOT PICK IT UP.

Nestled in the heart of Shrewsbury Borough, the Shrewsbury Community Garden is more than just a place to grow fruits, vegetables, and flowers — it's a space where neighbors come together, friendships bloom and the spirit of community thrives.

Now in its 13th season, the Community Garden promotes sustainability, healthy living, and local engagement. All produce is grown organically. **Two plots are dedicated to growing fresh produce that is donated to local food banks and organizations that promote family services such as Monmouth Daycare.**

This year participation is at an all time high. In addition to individual plots, the garden has welcomed participation by ARC members who are tending to their own plot.

One of the garden's core values is accessibility — both in the physical layout of the space and its welcoming culture. Two raised plots are reserved for those with mobility challenges. The walkway leading to the garden entrance is wheelchair accessible.

You don't need a green thumb to get involved.

In fact, many gardeners arrive as beginners and leave as passionate growers. The Garden Committee, a group of volunteer residents, in concert with "Master Gardeners" provide support and education through out the growing season. Each season culminates with a Harvest Fest (as seen in our photos) where all members of the garden are invited to come together to share a meal often made up of the fruits of their labor.
